A Unique Program

The **Peacebuilders Initiative** is an innovative ministry and leadership development program sponsored by Catholic Theological Union, geared for high school youth. Originally funded in 2001 by the Lilly Endowment Inc., Peacebuilders challenges young men and women to explore the theology of peace and deepen their understanding of their faith. High school students chosen to participate in Peacebuilders learn the skills necessary for leadership, conflict resolution, and peacemaking. Guided by dedicated teachers and mentors, the Peacebuilders experience is grounded in prayer, reflection, and faith sharing.

The **Peacebuilders Initiative** employs a holistic, comprehensive approach to open the eyes and hearts of young people to a call to ministry. This unique approach includes:

The Summer Program—a week-long session featuring theology taught by CTU faculty, along with liturgy, and practical, hands-on ministry

The Peace Project—to implement the skills and experience participants gained in the summer session in a project they create to promote peace and justice in their schools and communities.

Follow-up Retreats—keep the participants connected and grounded in their common faith experience, and provide support for their ongoing Peace Projects.
